

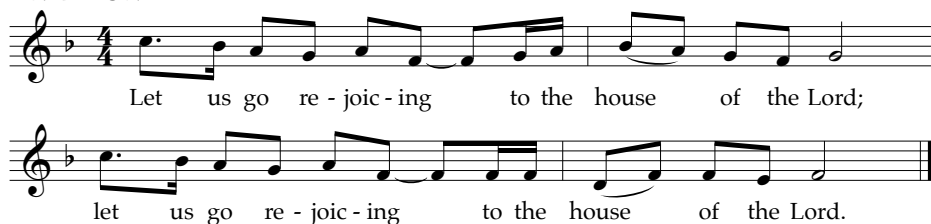

of the house of David.

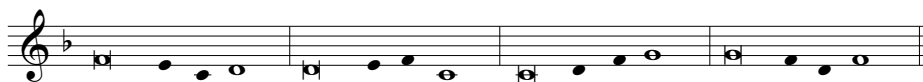
For the peace of Jerusalem pray:
